Individual Tutoring

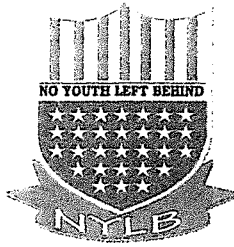
We will personalize academic help, tailored to the individual's needs. We will focus primarily on the areas that the individual needs help. The tutor **will not** provide answers, but will assist in problem solving so the young person can get the answer themselves. We will use college students that have been properly trained to be tutors to tutor in their particular major. We help students gain the tools they need to excel academically and build confidence.

Some areas we will tutor in are English, Mathematics, Literature, Writing, Reading Comprehension, Test Preparation, & History.

Counseling

We will assist our youth in learning how to face certain issues through information, guidance and support. In this program we will highlight personal strengths. This curriculum may change according to the needs of the youths and the advice of the counselors

1. We will provide a safe emotional environment to explore their situation
2. Individual counseling will be provided
3. Group open night discussions (based on pre-approved topics)
4. Talk about peer pressure and how to cope
5. Advice Night
6. Help identify things that create stress
7. Explore ways to eliminate stress or keep it under control
8. Anger management



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Foreign Language

Young people will learn the basic in at least one foreign language, primarily Spanish. Develop the ability to maintain a simple conversation in familiar environments and daily situations, expressing ideas in the present, past and future tenses. This curriculum will change according to instructor ideas and interests of the youths.

1. Learn to read and speak simple words
2. Read and speak the alphabet
3. Group conversations in the foreign language

Introduction to the Arts

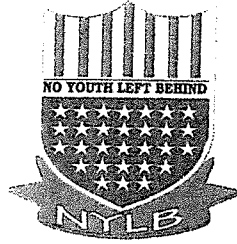
The Arts provide opportunities for youth to do something positive and creative. This curriculum will change at will.

1. learn how to use the Arts to communicate difficult thoughts and emotions
2. Creative and Artistic expression
3. Dance
4. Visual Art techniques
5. Learn to relate Art to life experiences
6. Performances, exhibitions, and display of public art works

Community Service Projects

Children are encouraged to participate in volunteer service in many forms ranging from individual volunteer activities to service projects organized by student groups. They will learn to put their knowledge and ideas into practice by helping to solve real community problems alongside other community members.
